Fullbrook School Cycle Permit Safety Rules

The following conditions are not all the law, but **they are the requirements** for you to retain your permit to bring your bike onto school property.

Do	Don't	
Have your permit with you at all times	Forget to re-new your permit every year Keep a permit if you no longer use it	
Wear your helmet correctly fitted and fastened on your head as soon as you collect your bike/ leave your house	Take it off round the corner, wear one too small, leave the strap unfastened	
Lock your bike up in the shed every morning	Leave your bike outside the shed or unlocked at any time	
Make sure that you are not on your bike at all whilst on school property	Straddle the bike whilst walking, lend your bike to someone else to ride in school	
Ride single file along the side of the road	Weave on and off the pavement and road, ride abreast of others in the road	
Dismount when travelling along footpaths and alleyways	Race along alleyways and footpaths	
Concentrate on the road and traffic when you are travelling to/from school	Be surprised if you lose your cycle permit due to any of these conditions being broken
