PARENT PARKING & ONE WAY SYSTEM

Unfortunately we find ourselves having to raise the issue of inconsiderate parking from some of our parents & carers with you once again. Over the past few weeks there have been more and more instances of parents being hugely inconsiderate towards our neighbours, and drivers needing to access and exit the Fullbrook site during drop off and pick times. This includes blocking driveway access for residents on Selsdon Road and Keston Avenue, and vehicles stopping across the junction on the bend where these two roads meet. The second issue is particularly dangerous as it also causes a bottleneck for traffic and puts our students at risk as they make their way to and from school. If you must drop off/pick up your child/children then please consider parking slightly further away on a quieter road or where there is designated parking such as the Woodlands Avenue car park in West Byfleet which can be accessed quickly by students via the path that runs down the side of the Fullbrook site and over the canal (a 5 minute walk at most).

We would like to take this opportunity to also remind you of the voluntary one way system which we ask our parent and carer community to follow to help alleviate the traffic issues around the school during those busy times, and to be mindful of our neighbours who are often disrupted by the high volume of cars parked along the roads and travelling down them. 

Pasta La Vista!

Thanks to the generosity of the local community, we now have more than enough Pasta at our warehouse and so we have been thinking of some recipes to use up the surplus...

Please see this simple recipe below:

Hot dog and Bean Pasta

- Cook any pasta you have in your cupboard.
- 5 minutes before the pasta has cooked add a tin of hot dogs and a tin of mixed beans.
- Once the pasta has cooked, drain the water, leave the pasta and beans to cool.
- Roughly slice the hotdogs and add to the pasta.
- Once the pasta, hot dogs and beans have cooled add a few tablespoons of mayonnaise, a pinch of salt and pepper and mix until the pasta is well coated. Store any leftovers in the fridge for the next day.
